- There must be an ever renewing spirit and commitment in our churches to reach out. The best church revitalization that I know of is when a church begins to look beyond themselves and reach out to others for Christ. Revival comes when church is not just about us and our issues but on bringing others to Jesus. I once heard a pastor say that most churches are either "fussing or fishing."
